

### Medicaid Coverage of Medications for the Treatment of Opioid Use Disorder

In Kentucky between 2008-2012, persons enrolled in substance use treatment programs that prescribed



methadone **increased 0.3%**. In 2012 in Kentucky, **17.2%** of persons aged 12 and older who met criteria for having a drug use disorder received treatment $^{\alpha}$ .

# State Benefits at a Glance $^{\beta}$ ...

#### Methadone

Kentucky Medicaid <u>does not cover</u> methadone under Fee-For-Service (FFS) plans.

Buprenorphine/Naloxone film (Suboxone ®), Buprenorphine/Naloxone tablets (generic), Buprenorphine/Naloxone tablets (Zubsolv ®) and Buprenorphine tablets (generic).

#### **Medication Limitations**

Kentucky Medicaid covers Suboxone, buprenorphine/naloxone tablets, and buprenorphine tablets under FFS plans with the following limitations:

- In order to approve these medications for the treatment of opioid use disorder, patients <u>must be enrolled in</u>, or have documented proof, of SUD\* counseling.
- Suboxone, buprenorphine/naloxone tablets, and buprenorphine tablets must tapered to the minimum dose <u>after</u> 8 months of initial treatment.
- The maximum daily dose of Suboxone, buprenorphine/naloxone tablets, and buprenorphine tablets after <u>6 months</u> <u>treatment is 24mg/day</u>.
- Suboxone, buprenorphine/naloxone tablets, and buprenorphine tablets require prior authorization for use.
- No information was provided for Zubsolv.

Kentucky covers Suboxone, buprenorphine/naloxone tablets, and Buprenorphine tablets as a pharmacy benefit under FFS plans.

These medications are not listed on Kentucky's preferred drug list for FFS plans, but they are on the preferred list for Managed Care plans (MC). Suboxone, buprenorphine/naloxone tablets, and buprenorphine tablets are covered for use in a physician's office under FFS plans.


## Injectable Naltrexone (VIVITROL®)

Kentucky Medicaid covers injectable naltrexone (Vivitrol<sup>®</sup>) under both FFS and MC plans. Patients **do not** need to be enrolled in, or have documented proof of, SUD\* counseling for Vivitrol coverage.

- Vivitrol is covered as a <u>pharmacy benefit under FFS plans</u>.
- Vivitrol also appears on Kentucky's preferred drug list under FFS plans.
- Vivitrol is covered for use in a physician's office-based setting under FFS plans.
