MILLENNIUM RESEARCH INSTITUTE ANNOUNCES INAUGURAL FELLOWSHIP WINNER Dr. Sarah Bagley to be honored at American Society of Addiction Medicine Conference

SAN DIEGO and ORLANDO, FI. (April 9, 2014)—Millennium Research Institute (MRI) today announced Dr. Sarah Bagley, a fellow in addiction medicine in the Section of General Internal Medicine at Boston University Medical Center in Boston, as the inaugural recipient of the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) and Millennium Research Institute Research Fellowship Award, which provides funding to promising young researchers in the area of addiction treatment. MRI is a nonprofit national research center focused on advancing the science and outcome of pain management and addiction through education, research and advocacy. ASAM is the leading professional society representing addiction medicine physicians and associated professionals.

Bagley was selected on the merit of her research, which will retrospectively look at discrepancies between self-reported drug use and urine drug testing (UDT) results in an urban, academic primary care-based buprenorphine clinic setting. She will seek to assess the association between conflicting self-reports and UDT results at baseline and in the course of treatment with outcomes at 12 months, including treatment retention, subsequent UDT results and doses of buprenorphine. The research should add to the growing body of evidence describing the clinical application and value of urine drug testing as an objective diagnostic tool in the treatment of substance use disorders.

According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), 23.1 million people ages 12 and older needed treatment for an illicit drug or alcohol use problem in 2012, but only 2.5 million received treatment at a specialty facility¹. The disease of addiction can be managed with the appropriate access to quality treatment, including diagnostic tests such as UDT, and the benefits of early intervention and treatment can have substantial effects. Education and addiction research are essential components to improving available options for those in need, and will allow for continued advancements in clinical practice.

"This fellowship exemplifies our continued commitment to supporting research around best practices in addiction treatment to improve the lives of patients who are suffering," said Kathy Egan City, president and executive director of the Millennium Research Institute. "Research like Dr. Bagley's plays a critical role in advancing the practice of addiction medicine to address this major public health issue."
