

## Medical Clinical Title Faculty Position

The Center on Drug and Alcohol Research and the Department of Behavioral Science in the College of Medicine at the University of Kentucky, is seeking an Assistant- or Associate-level Research Professor to work on substance abuse projects with an emphasis on pharmacotherapy and intervention research. This individual would join a productive and collaborative research team conducting both inpatient and outpatient clinical studies related to substance abuse and its treatment. The incumbent's responsibilities would include participating in all aspects of protocol development and implementation, development of extramural support and provision of medical supervision for studies. It is expected that this individual will also provide some clinical service as appropriate, but the majority of effort would be related to research activities. The position is in the non-tenured clinical title series with an appointment in the Department of Behavioral Science, and candidates should qualify for faculty appointment. Adjunct appointment in an appropriate clinical department will be made with consideration of the candidate's specialty area (e.g., Internal Medicine, Psychiatry, etc.). The University of Kentucky is located in Lexington, Kentucky known for its outstanding quality of life. Lexington is a growing community of approximately 330,000 with excellent schools, diverse business and industry, excellent recreational opportunities, and a variety of cultural events. The Medical Clinical Assistant/Associate Professor will be encouraged to carry out independent research on drug and alcohol abuse, mental health, and ancillary medical services, and will be expected to obtain extramural funding to establish and maintain an independent research program. An M.D./D.O. degree and medical license are required; an Addiction Medicine specialty is preferred but not required. Competitive candidates will have demonstrated an ability to carry out research and be able to effectively communicate with clinical research staff and with program and service providers. Applicants should submit a vita and three letters of reference to Dr. Sharon Walsh, Center on Drug and Alcohol Research, 515 Oldham Court, Lexington, KY 40502.
